• Immediate Response – Importance

- FIRST MOVERS
- Acquainted with Local situation & local people
- Coordinators with security forces and rescue teams



Civil Society & Youths Mobilization

- Scenario in Numbers
 - More than 100000 people got mobilized from different organizations like Rotary, Lions, FNCCI, Local clubs etc.
 - About 40000 youths got involved in different volunteering works for about 8 days post first EQ
 - Almost 4000 youths and civil society members are still in some or other volunteering work for Relief and Rehab

Civil Society & Youths Mobilization



- FNCCI Operation Relief

- More than 25 organizations in OR with 22 Civil society leaders – NAS, REDCROSS, KARUNA & many...
- About 3500 youths got involved as Volunteers
- 18 International Medical Units and 5 rescue teams
- 53 District chambers involvement in relief material
- First mover in the field besides govt. with relief materials

- Use IT, Local Media & SOCIAL MEDIA to reach out
- DELEGATE to EXPERTS
- AUDIO VISUAL TEACHING aids are very HELPFUL

Civil Society & Youths Mobilization

• BIGGER CONCERNS

- Untrained manpower for rescue
 - Could have avoided casualties
- Proper Orientation for Disaster Preparedness
 - could save lives
- Emergency KIT should be stored
- Auto evolving Model of Relief Camps
- KEY information centers could avoid duplication
- Authorized HELP DESKS at Airport could manage International Teams better
